

- Web based documentation system
- Easy access through computer and smart devices
- Documentation of work done together with young persons
- Gather information to use for follow up and development of youth work
- Make communication between youth workers easier
- International system – improve youth work together – the same core principle of youth work

Phase 1 (Jan – May 2015)

How is documentation being done in the different countries? Common needs for documentation of youth work.


Phase 2 (June – September 2015)

Agree on how the system should function and create a sketch for it.

Phase 3

17 Nov - First mockup of the system -Feedback from RISE at Dublin meeting

15 Feb - First version of the system in four languages available





Phase 4 (February 15th – April 2016)

Test phase users in each country tests the system and gives feedback

Phase 5 (May – August 2016)

Improve the system - feedback from the test users

Phase 6 (September – December 2016)

Dissemination events

Common needs

- Open/drop-in YW
- Groups/programs
- Visitors/visits
- Staff/Volunteers
- Youth participation (produced/organised by youth)
- Age, gender
- Archive – (upload doc, pic)

Level of participation

- Assisting/ actively engaged = helping out in activity
- Producing/ facilitating = been a part of organising, preparing and carrying out the activity



Terms and conditions

- No sensitive information
- Child protection guidelines
- Personal data
 - Any information relating to an identified or identifiable person is considered personal data
