Description

Cinisello Balsamo organized two identical workshops with two different classes in a high school in Cinisello Balsamo.

During the workshops, they did different activities:

At first, we asked the students some questions about their personal use of digital tools and how their approach has changed during the pandemic (through a digital tool for non-formal education). Then, we presented the project and its goals and we created a moment of discussion on the topic of active digital participation. Among the achievements, there is an overview of digital usage among high school youth, which was very interesting because differences emerged between the two workshops.

The workshop had the goal to collect data about Digital Civic Participation in Italy. In order to collect more information about this theme we also did online research to know all the existing Digital Participation forms in our country. Moreover, we did an online survey that aimed to find out how many people know about Digital Participation and if they could provide examples of it.

From the workshop we got interesting results: at the beginning of the activity almost none of the students knew what Digital Civic Participation was. Before the workshops, as we predict this result we set in the agenda presentation about Digital Participation. After the explanation, during the debate, we found out that all the students were interested and supported Digital Participation and they also thought about how they can use it in their schools.

We hope that thanks to this project Digital Participation will be more used and known. Those two workshops, the research and the survey were the first steps for creating and spreading the knowledge and awareness of Digital Civic Participation. In the next month, thanks to this project, we would like to spread the use of Digital Participation in our Municipality.

Through our activities we involve a lot of young people in European projects: this helps us to create a network of youth among us that are interested in EU projects. Furthermore, our participation in European partnerships gives us the possibility to expand our network of partners and to know new people to work with. Working with a lot of people from different countries, cultures and backgrounds is a privilege for us, thanks to them we have been familiar with new different ways of work.
